



“CMS Restraint and Seclusion: Navigating the Most Problematic of All of the CMS Hospital Standards and Proposed Changes” Webinar (#T4089)

Program Overview:

Restraint and seclusion is a “hot spot” with both CMS and the Joint Commission, and a common area where hospitals are cited for being out of compliance. The restraint policy is one of the hardest to write and understand in healthcare today. This session will help simplify the CMS 50-page interpretive guidelines. It will also provide a crosswalk to the Joint Commission standards.

The speaker will discuss the requirements for an internal log and what must be in the log for patients who die in one or two soft wrist restraints, and will include what must be documented in the medical record as well. She will also discuss the reporting requirements for patients who die within 24 hours of being put in restraints.

Learning Objectives:

At the completion of this webinar, participants will be able to:

1. List what a hospital must document in the internal log if a patient dies within 24 hours of being restrained with two soft wrist restraints;
2. Discuss the CMS requirement in which all physicians, and other staff, who order restraints, must be educated on the hospital policy;
3. Describe the CMS restraint education requirements for staff; and
4. Discuss the specific items CMS requires be documented in the medical record for the one hour face-to-face evaluation on patients who are violent and/or self destructive.

Target Audience:

All nurses and physicians with direct patient care, CMO, CNO, COO, nurse educator, risk manager, patient safety officer, PI director, TJC coordinator, quality director, hospital legal counsel, compliance officers, accreditation and regulation staff. Others that should attend include staff who remove and apply restraints as part of their care such as radiology techs, ultra sound technologists and transport staff.
