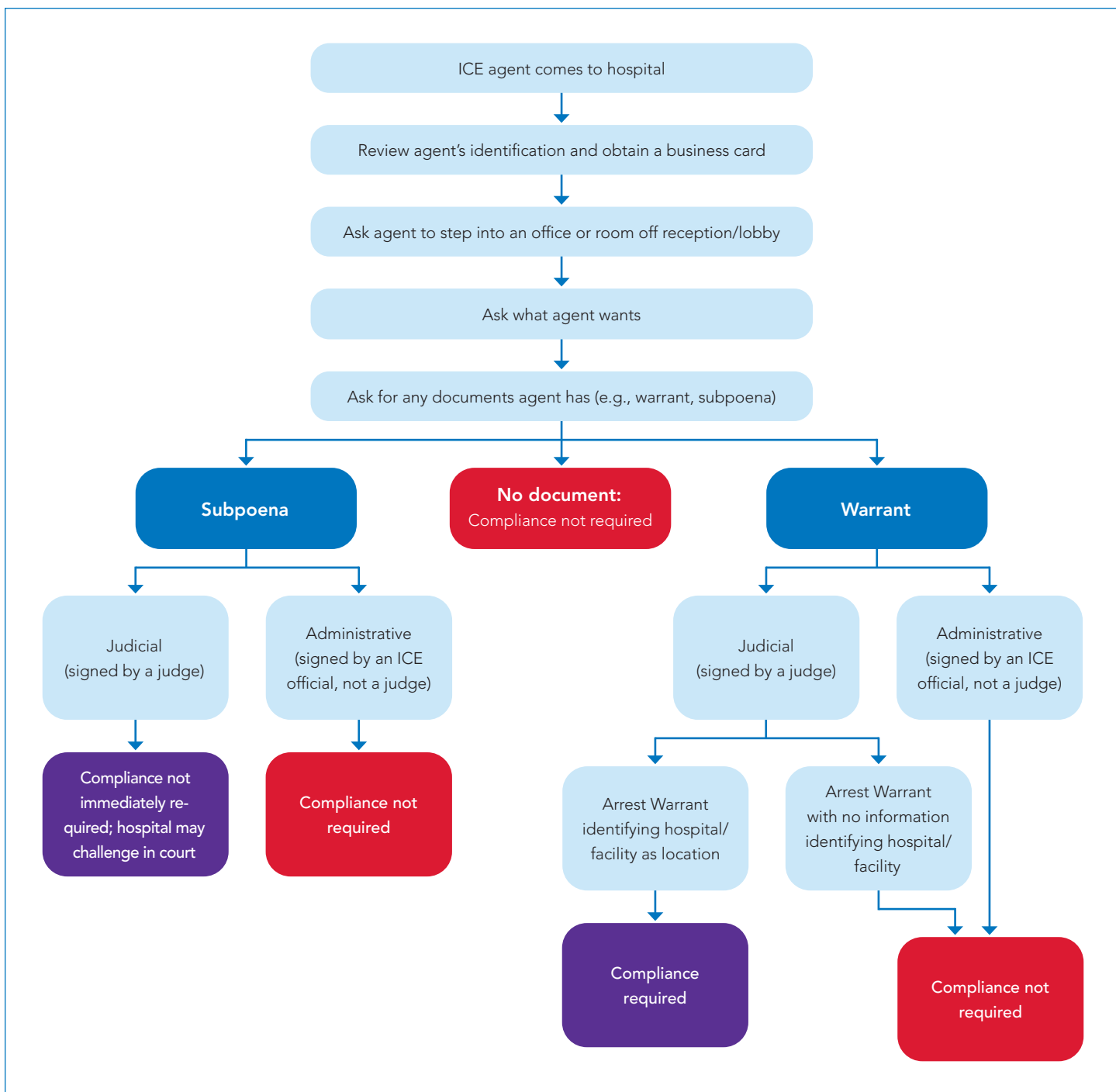

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WHAT TO DO IF ICE COMES TO THE HOSPITAL



DOCUMENT MATRIX

Document	What it is	What it could be used for	Effect on hospital
Administrative warrant	Document signed by an ICE official (usually an agent), not a judge	To make an arrest or confiscate records	Compliance not required
Judicial warrant	Document signed by a judge	To make arrest or confiscate records	Compliance required if hospital on warrant is identified
Deportation order	Document stating that a person is subject to deportation	To deport a person from the U.S.	Compliance by hospital not required; a deportation order is not the same thing as a judicial warrant
Administrative subpoena	Document signed by an ICE official (usually an agent), not a judge	To compel appearance or production of records in court by a certain date	Compliance not required
Judicial subpoena	Document signed by a judge	To compel appearance or production of records in court by a certain date	Compliance not immediately required; hospital may challenge in court
